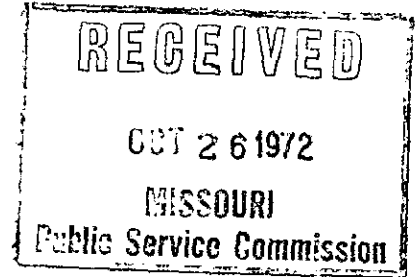

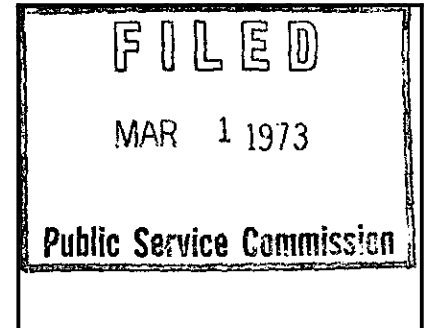

1. Automatic Callback--This feature allows a customer to make a call to the last directory number called. The callback can be made if the called number was busy or idle and whether the call was answered or not.

B. Service Descriptions (Continued)

- 2. Automatic Recall--This feature allows a customer to place a call to the source of the last incoming call to the customer.
- 3. Call Forwarding--This feature allows a customer to transfer all incoming calls to another dialable telephone number.
- 4. Call Hold--This feature allows a customer to return the telephone's handset to its hook while a call is in progress.
- 5. Call Waiting--Provides a signal to a customer using the telephone that another call is being attempted to his number. The customer can "hold" the original call to answer the incoming call.
- 6. Distinctive Ring/Directory Number-- This feature allows a customer to receive a distinctive ringing pattern on a second directory phone number using the same equipment as the first phone number.
- 7. Speed Calling 8 and 30 number--This feature allows a customer to reach preset number by abbreviated dialing. The system allows the customer to alter his speed calling list.
- 8. Three Way Calling--This feature allows a customer to add a third party to an existing conversation. The Three Way Calling (TWC) feature is a software function and requires no additional equipment. The party initiating a three way call (the controller) may place one party on hold while dialing and talking to a second party. The controller may then include the held party in a three way connection. The added party may be dropped from the connection by a flash from the controller.

Multiple three way calls may be connected by "chaining" the calls, provided the chaining is done by a non-controlling party in an established three way call. The chaining function is restricted when the System Option "Three Way Calling Originator Only" option has been enabled.
- 9. Wakeup Call--This feature allows a wakeup call to be set up to ring a customer's telephone at a pre-programmed time.

B. Class Service Descriptions (Continued)

1. Calling Name Delivery--This feature allows the customer to associate a name with the calling number. The name is retrieved from a centralized database. If the calling party's name is not available, a letter "O" for out of area appears. If the name is restricted, a "P" for privacy is shown (the subscriber's equipment interprets the "O" and "P" and displays appropriate text.)
2. Calling Number Delivery--This feature allows the calling party Directory Number to be passed to the called party's line. The Directory Number is transmitted as a ten digit string. If the calling Directory Number is not available, a letter 'O' for out of area, or 'P' for privacy will be transmitted (the customer's equipment will interpret the 'O' and 'P' and display appropriate text).
3. Customer Originated Call Trace--This feature allows a customer to identify calling lines in order to determine the source of nuisance or threatening calls. After hanging up on a nuisance call, a user can invoke Customer Originated Trace by going off-hook, receiving dial tone, and then dialing the Customer Originated Trace access code *57 on Touch Tone phone (1157 rotary dial). A confirmation tone will be returned to indicate that the call has been traced successfully. Output is in the form of a maintenance log at telephone company. This feature does not work with automatic recall and call back.

The customer using the feature would be required to contact authorities for further action. The customer is not provided the traced number. The results of a successful trace will only be provided to law enforcement authorities with a subpoena.

Customer Originated Trace will trace only those calls which are originated from a location served by the Class network.

4. Enhanced Call Privileges--Consist of the following:
 - a. Account Code -Forced--This feature prevents the use of a telephone by unauthorized individuals.
 - b. Account Code-Verified--This feature is an account code that can be dialed by a customer when certain features or enhanced facilities are required (but which are not normally available to the customer). The account code can be entered by the customer at any telephone. The entry of the account code changes the service category of the customer to the service category (and its associated features) assigned to the account code. The facility restriction of the customer is also changed, when the account code is entered, to the restriction assigned to the account code. These changes only apply for the duration of the call.

- c. Personal Account Code--This feature allows a customer to set up or change a personal account code (PAC) which can be used to invoke various service category options assigned to their line i.e., call restriction and enhanced call privileges.

CALLER ID

Caller ID is one of the products which Alma Telephone Company will offer. This feature enables the customer to view on a display unit the Calling Party Directory name and/or number (CPN) on incoming telephone calls.

When Caller ID is activated on a customer's line, the CPN of incoming calls are displayed on the called CPE during the first long silent interval of the ringing cycle.

Per line blocking for the blocking of CPN will be available upon request, at no charge, only to the following entities for lines over which the official business of the agency is conducted, including those at the residences of employees/volunteers, where an executive officer of the agency registers a need for blocking and provides the required certification to Alma Telephone Company: a private, nonprofit, tax exempt, domestic violence intervention agencies and federal, state, and local law enforcement agencies. The CPN will not be transmitted from a line equipped with this capability. Per line blocking is operational on a continuous basis but can be deactivated by the customer by dialing an access code immediately prior to placing a call.

Line blocking customers can unblock their CPN information on a per call basis, at no charge, by dialing an access code (#82 on their Touch Tone pad or 1182 from a rotary phone) immediately prior to placing a call.

A customer may prevent the delivery of their calling name and or number to the called party by dialing an access code (#67 on their Touch Tone pad or 1167 from a rotary phone) immediately prior to placing a call. The access code will activate per call blocking, which is available at no charge. If the calling party activates blocking, the CPN will not be transmitted across the line to the called party. Instead, Calling Line Identification customers will receive an anonymous indicator.. This anonymous indicator notifies the Caller ID customer that the calling party has elected to block the delivery of their name and telephone number. The blocking of CPN will not be provided on calls originating from Customer-Owned Pay Telephone Service. If the caller ID customer also subscribes to Anonymous Call Rejection, the calling party will be routed to a telephone company recording advising the caller that the called party will not accept calls whose CPN has been blocked.

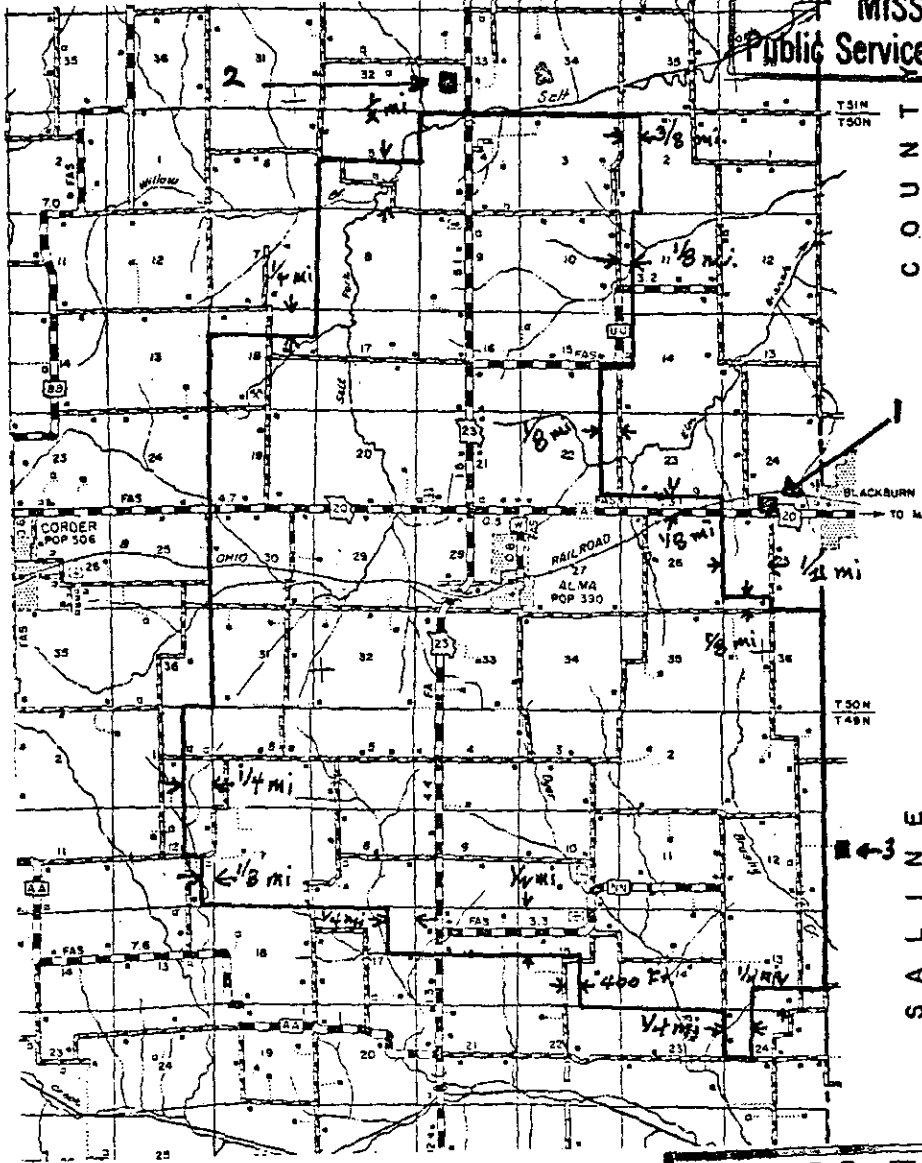

A. Service Connection Charges

JAN 15 1997

The term "Service Connection Charges" is used to define the nonrefundable charge made for the establishment of a class of telephone service or subsequent additions to that service and are in addition to any other scheduled rates and charges normally applying under the Tariffs.

Service Connection Charges may be payable at the time application is made for the particular service or facility, and prior to establishment of service or upon presentation of a bill.

Service connection charges do not apply to:

1. Hold for Future Use
2. Directory listings.
3. Service changed from a residence to a business classification, or vice versa.
4. Service reestablished after the destruction or partial destruction of the subscriber's premises by means beyond the control of the subscriber whether at the same or another location. However, if service is established at a new location and the subscriber later moves back to the old location, the Service Connection Charge is applied in connection with the reestablished service at the old location.

For an individual customer dwelling this point of connection will generally be the modular jack incorporated into the customer side of the Network Interface Device (NID). The drop wire and the network protector will continue to be provided by, and remain the property of, the telephone company. The demarcation point is usually the point at which the telephone company wiring connects with the customer's wiring.

B. MOVES AND CHANGES CHARGES

The charges specified herein for Moves and Changes do not contemplate work being performed by the Telephone Company employees involved at a time when overtime wages apply, due to the request of the customer, nor does it contemplate work once begun being interrupted by the customer. If the customer requests that overtime labor be performed or interrupts work once begun, an additional charge, based on the additional costs involved, applies.

- 1. Moves and Changes charges apply where access service is transferred from one demarcation point to another demarcation point on the same premises where there is no interruption of the service other than is incident to the work involved. ----- \$9.00
- 2. Move Outside of Building receives same treatment as New Installation as far as charge purposes are concerned. A. General Regulations

1. Payphone Service includes lines to which coin, coinless, card reader or a combination of coin/card reader telephones may be attached.
2. Payphone Service is a two-way or, optionally, one-way originating only business exchange access line composed of the serving central office line equipment, all outside plant facilities needed to connect the serving central office with the customer's premises, and the Network Interface Device at the demarcation point. These facilities are Company-provided and maintained and provide access to and from the telecommunications network for long distance service and local calling.
3. In the case of one-way service, intercept treatment will be provided.
4. A maximum of one customer-provided instrument may be connected to any one Instrument or CO implemented coin line.
5. General Rules and Regulations found in other sections of this tariff are applicable to the provision of Payphone Service.
6. Directory listings may be provided under the regulations governing the furnishing of listings for business subscribers.
7. A Network Interface Device will be installed at a location mutually agreed upon by the Payphone Service Provider and the Company. The Network Interface Device is a company-provided jack or its equivalent. It is the point of connection between the telephone company owned wiring and wiring owned by the Customer.
8. One directory will be distributed to the Payphone Service Provider without charge for each payphone business exchange line.
9. Installation Charges and the appropriate Network Interface Device (NID) material charge are applicable for the installation, move or rearrangement of the NID on the customer's premises to establish or reestablish network access.

E. Central Office (CO) Implemented Coin Line

1. Central Office Implemented Coin Line provides coin signaling. It is a line side connection from the local exchange switch to the point of demarcation at the customer premise.
2. Features are additives to the operation of a flat rate access line that provide for CO Implemented coin line service. The Company offers those features that are provided by the functionality of the Company's switches. These include coin supervision, coin control (collect and return of coins, if applicable), and answer supervision. CO implemented coin line features that are implemented by the functionality of an operator service provider, such as coin rating, coin refund, repair referral, and operator call screening, are the responsibility of the Payphone service provider (Customer).
3. CO Implemented Coin Line features, including coin line signaling, coin collect and return (where applicable) and answer supervision, are provided by the Telephone Company per the technology available from the Company's facilities. It shall be the responsibility of the CO Implemented Coin Line payphone owner to assure technical and operational compatibility with the coin line features offered by the Telephone Company.

F. Features and Functions

1. Answer Supervision provides signaling on the line notifying the line that the called party has answered. This feature is an additive to the CO Implemented Coin Line.
2. Coin Collection and Return provides an electrical signal on a CO Implemented Line indicating to the payphone equipment to collect coin(s) from or return coin(s) to the calling party. This feature is an additive to the CO Implemented Coin Line.
3. Special Number Assignment is a specific number requested by the customer. This service is available where facilities are accessible and it is technical feasible to provide. This feature is an additive to the CO Implemented Coin Line or to the Instrument Implemented Payphone Service.
4. Selective Class of Call Screening will be provided where such facilities are available at the customer's option. Selective Class of Call Screening treatment enables the customer to restrict outgoing operator-handled calls, placed over the Telephone Company's network, from the service point to only those calls which are charged to a called telephone, a third number or a calling card.
5. Validation may be performed through Originating-Line Screening (OLS). OLS enables operator service providers to determine whether there are billing restrictions on the exchange access line from which a call originates. OLS service delivers codes on operator assisted calls to identify calls originating from privately owned payphones, inmate locations, and hotels/motels, etc. Rates for this service are found in the appropriate interstate access tariff, when facilities and service are available. The customer has the option to request either Selective Class of Call Screening or OLS.

A discount from standard monthly rates for local exchange business service may be allowed in connection with service furnished through the Missouri School Discount Program, pursuant to the Video Instructional Development and Educational Opportunity Program, as enacted by the Missouri State Legislature.
 2. Upon the customer's request, a discount of twenty percent (20%) from standard monthly access line rates may be allowed to educational institutions within the Company's certified area, as determined in Paragraph 3, following.
 3. An educational institution shall be defined either as an accredited public school, or an accredited private school which is tax exempt pursuant to 26 U.S.C. § 501(c)(3). Persons operating home schools, as defined in § 167.031 RSMo, shall not be eligible for this school discount program. Private schools must be accredited by either the Missouri Chapter of the National Federation of Non-Public Schools Accrediting Association, Independent Schools Association of the Central States, North Central Association of Colleges and Schools, and/or the University of Missouri-Columbia. Public Schools must be accredited by the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education for the State of Missouri and/or the North Central Association of Colleges and Schools.
 4. The qualifying discount will be permitted only on the local exchange access line. All other features, ancillary services or options, relative to the particular service, shall continue to be billed at the appropriate tariffed rates.
 5. The qualifying discount will be permitted only where the predominant use is providing educational and instructional programs and for the educational institutions' administrative use. The discount is not allowed to residential complexes associated with the institution.
 6. In addition to meeting the qualification specified in Paragraph 3 preceding, an eligible customer must sign an affidavit certifying that the qualification is met. The affidavit will be retained on file with the Company.
 7. The customer should request to receive the discount on all subsequent additions of eligible services which are ordered. There will be no additional affidavits required.

1. Lifeline service is available to qualifying low-income subscribers for single party residence service.
2. Lifeline service is a reduction in the monthly local service charges normally paid by qualifying low-income consumers. Eligible Lifeline subscribers will receive a total reduction of their basic local rate for residential one party service \$8.25. The components of the reduction to basic residential one-party rates are as follows: *

The Federal baseline lifeline reduction shall be used to waive the consumers federal End- User Common Line charge.
3. Lifeline will not be furnished on a Foreign Exchange service.
4. Lifeline service shall not be disconnected for non-payment of toll charges.
5. Toll blocking provides a means of restricting access to the Long Distance Message Telecommunications Network. Toll blocking for the purposes of lifeline service will restrict 1+, 0+ and 0- (operator handled) calls.
 - a. If the customer chooses "toll blocking" the company will not charge a service deposit.
 - b. Toll blocking is offered to Lifeline subscribers at no charge.

B. Eligibility Requirements

1. An applicant must meet all of the following criteria in order to qualify for Lifeline Service.
 - a. To qualify for Lifeline the consumer must participate in one of the following programs:
 1. Medicaid
 2. Food Stamps

- A. **General-** A low-income customer is any customer who requests or receives residential essential local telecommunications service and who has been certified by the Department of Social Services (DSS) as economically disadvantaged.  7. One (1) standard white pages directory listing
 8. Toll blocking or toll control for qualifying low-income customers
- D. **Support Amount-** Customers eligible under the established criteria can receive a discount from their bill for essential local telecommunications service equal to the amounts approved by the Missouri Public Service Commission and the Federal Communications Commission. The amount of combined federal and state lifeline support for any customer will not exceed the sum of the federal Subscriber Line Charge (SLC) and the recurring charges for essential local telecommunications services (including the basic service rate, Touch-Tone calling charge, extended area service additive, and mileage additives, if any).

2. Missouri USF Disabled Assistance

- A. **General-** A disabled customer, or a dependent, is a customer who requests or receives residential essential local telecommunications service, as defined in section 1(c) of this tariff, and meets the eligibility requirements set forth in this tariff.

The Link Up Missouri Service Connection Program is a Federal Lifeline assistance program applicable to eligible residential subscribers, as defined below, and designed to promote subscribership to the telephone network among low income residential households.

Service Connection Charges, as set forth in this tariff*, for initial installation of the main residential service access line, will be discounted at a rate of 50 percent, or \$30.00, whichever is less. These reduced charges shall be assessed only for a single residential telephone line per eligible household at the principle place of residence.

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

A. APPLICATION

The rules and regulations specified herein are in addition to those contained in the Local Exchange Service Tariffs, the General Exchange Service Tariffs and the Long Distance Service Tariffs. They apply to the intrastate services and facilities furnished in Missouri by the Alma Telephone Company, hereinafter referred to as the Telephone Company, or Company. Failure on the part of the subscribers to observe these rules and regulations of the Telephone Company, after due notice of such failure, automatically gives the Telephone Company the privilege to cancel the contract and discontinue the furnishing of service.

In the event of a conflict between any rate, rule, regulations or provision contained in these General Rules and Regulations and any rate, rule, regulation or provision contained in the Local Exchange Service Tariffs, the General Exchange Service Tariffs or the Long Distance Service Tariffs, the rate, rule, regulation or provision contained in the specific Tariffs shall prevail.

These Tariffs cancel and supersede all other Tariffs of the Telephone Company issued and effective prior to the effective dates of this Tariff.

- (a) The Telephone Company's liability for damages on account of interruptions to service due to errors or omissions in directory listings will be limited to a pro rate abatement of the charge for such of the subscriber's service as is affected, the maximum abatement not to exceed one-half the service charges for the period from the date of issuance of the directory in which the mistake occurred to the date of issuance of a new directory containing the proper listing.
- (b) In the cases of extra listings in the alphabetical section of the directory for which a charge is made, the Telephone Company's liability shall be limited to an amount not to exceed the established rate for such listing during the period which the error or omission continues.

4. Transmitting Messages

E. ESTABLISHMENT AND FURNISHING OF SERVICE

1. Application for Access Service (T)

(a) Applications for service must be made on the Telephone Company's standard form of application. These applications become contracts when accepted in writing by the Telephone Company, or upon the establishment of service. Applicants for service are required to pay in advance at the time application is made, all charges accruing for the first billing period for exchange service and equipment, and the service connection charge, if applicable. The terms and conditions specified in such contracts are subject to these General Rules and Regulations, the General Exchange Service Tariffs and the Local Exchange Service Tariffs and the Local Exchange Service Tariffs for the particular exchange from which service is to be furnished. Any change in rates, rules or regulations shall act as a modification of the contract to that extent, without further notice.

(b) Requests from subscribers for additional service may be made verbally, if the original contract provides for such additional service as may be ordered, and no advance payment will be required. A move from one location to another (Outside Move) within the same Exchange Area is not considered to terminate the contract and orders for such moves may be made verbally. (D)

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

F. TELEPHONE DIRECTORIES

1. Distribution

The telephone Company will furnish to its subscribers, without charge, only such directories as it deems necessary for the efficient use of the service. Other directories will be furnished at the discretion of the Company at a reasonable charge.

2. Ownership and Use

Directories regularly furnished to subscribers are the property of the Telephone Company, are loaned to subscribers only as an aid to the use of telephone service, and are to be returned to the Telephone Company on request or when new directories are issued. Subscribers must not deface or mutilate directories. The Telephone Company shall have the right to make a charge for directories issued in replacement of directories destroyed, defaced, or mutilated while in possession of the subscriber. No binder, holder, or auxillary cover, except such as may be provided by or with the consent of the Telephone Company, shall be used on or in connection with any directory furnished by the Telephone Company.

The directory period is from the day on which the directory is first distributed to the subscribers to the day the succeeding directory is first distributed to subscribers.
3. The initial contract period for Private Branch Exchange systems shall be as specified in the General Exchange Service Tariffs under the subheading "Private Branch Exchange Service."

GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

DISCONTINUANCE OF SERVICE

1. Service may be discontinued for any of the following reasons:
 - A. Nonpayment of an undisputed delinquent Basic Local Service charge. (C)
 - B. Failure to post a required deposit or guarantee.
 - C. Unauthorized use of the Telephone Company's facilities in a manner which creates an unsafe condition or creates the possibility of damage or destruction to such equipment.
 - D. Failure to comply with the terms of a settlement agreement. (T)
 - E. Refusal after reasonable notice to permit inspection, maintenance, or replacement of the Telephone Company's facilities up to the demarcation point. (T)
 - F. Material misrepresentation of identity in obtaining access utility service. (D)
 - G. As provided by state or federal law. (D)
2. The failure to pay charges not subject to Commission jurisdiction shall not constitute cause for discontinuance of service.
3. A written notice shall be sent by first class mail ten (10) days prior to discontinuance of service. As an alternative the company may deliver a written notice by hand to the customer at least 96 hours prior to discontinuance. (C)
4. Basic Local Telephone Service may be discontinued during normal business hours on or after the date specified in the notice of discontinuance. Such service shall not be discontinued on a day when the offices of the Telephone Company are not open to facilitate reconnection of service, or on a day immediately preceding such day. Such service shall not be discontinued for nonpayment of an undisputed delinquent charge until ten (10) days after a charge has become delinquent. (C)
5. At least twenty-four (24) hours preceding a discontinuance of basic local service the Telephone Company shall make a reasonable effort to contact the customer and advise them of the proposed discontinuance and what steps must be taken to avoid it. Reasonable efforts shall include either a written notice in addition to the notice required in section (3), a door hanger or at least one (1) telephone call attempt to reach the customer. (C)

B. MAIN ACCESS LINE EXTENSIONS (T)

Facilities provided without construction charge:

1. Under normal conditions, the Telephone Company, without charge, will extend its lines to reach applicants within the exchange service area, provided the following condition is satisfied:

- (a) The cost of construction of the required access line extension will not exceed seven times the estimated annual local exchange revenue from such applicant or applicants. (T)

When it is necessary for the Telephone Company to extend its plant in order to provide access service to a new subscriber or subscribers, and the condition above is not satisfied, the Telephone Company may require the prospective subscriber or subscribers, each to make an advance payment of the local exchange rent for the class of service requested by the prospective subscriber, on the following basis:

B. MAIN ACCESS LINE EXTENSIONS (cont'd) (T)

The advance payment as required above is in addition to the regular service connection charge, if applicable. No portion of the advance payment will be refunded if access service is terminated. (T)

Advance payments will be credited to the subscriber's account in the amount of the monthly local exchange rate, as service is rendered monthly, until the total advance payment has been refunded.

Where recircuiting is necessary in connection with a rural access line extension, the Telephone Company will bear the expenses of this recircuiting when the Telephone Company facilities only are involved. (T)

1.1 Installation of Access Lines Within Subdivisions. Telephone Lines Constructed, Installed and Owned by Utilities in Subdivisions Shall be Installed Underground. (T)(D)

1.1.1 The following definitions are used in this section of the tariff:

APPLICANT: The developer, builder, or other person, partnership, association, firm, private or public corporation, trust, estate, political subdivision, governmental agency, or other legal entity recognized by law, applying for the construction of an access line distribution system in a subdivision. (T)

BUILDING: A single structure roofed and enclosed within exterior walls, built for permanent use, erected, framed of component structural parts and unified in its entirety both physically and in operation for single-family residential occupancy in a subdivision. (Definition excludes mobile home).

SUBDIVISION: A lot, tract, or parcel of land divided into two or more lots, plots, sites or other divisions for use for new residential buildings or the land on which is constructed new multiple-occupancy buildings per a recorded plot thereof if such recordation is required by law.

1.1.2 The Telephone Company, upon receipt of the applicant's proper application, will install an underground access line system with suitable materials to assure that the applicant will receive reasonably safe and adequate access service. The provision of the underground access system will be provided at no charge except where a charge is permitted under paragraphs 1.1.4 and 1.1.6 of this section of the tariff. Temporary service is provided under paragraph 1.1.5 of this section of the tariff. (T)(D)

1.1.3 Rights-of-Way and Easements

A. Within the applicant's subdivision, the Telephone Company will construct, own, operate, and maintain underground access lines only along public streets, roads, and highways which the Telephone Company has the legal right to occupy, and on public lands and private property across which rights-of-way and easements satisfactory to the Telephone Company may be obtained without cost or need for condemnation by the Telephone Company.

B. Rights-of-way and easements, within the subdivision, satisfactory to the Telephone Company, must be furnished by the applicant in reasonable time to meet construction and service requirements before the Telephone Company shall be required to commence its installation. Such rights-of-way and easements must be cleared of trees, tree stumps, and other obstructions and graded to within six inches of final grade, by applicant, at no charge to the Telephone Company. Such clearance and grading must be maintained by the applicant during construction by the Telephone Company.

1.1.4 Advance Payments

A. Where, due to the manner in which a subdivision is developed, the Telephone Company is required to construct an underground telephone distribution system through a section or sections of the subdivision where service will not be connected for at least two years, then the Telephone Company may require an advance payment equal to the estimated cost of construction from the applicant before construction is commenced. If, in the judgment of the Telephone Company, an advance is required under the above conditions, the Telephone Company has the right to refuse installation of the underground system until the required advance is paid to the Telephone Company.

B. If an advance is required under these rules, then the advance, without interest, shall be returned to the applicant on a pro rata basis as the permanent service connection is made to each building or multiple-occupancy building.

C. Any portion of an advance remaining unrefunded ten years from the date the Telephone Company is first ready to render service with the access line extension will be retained by the Telephone Company and credited to the appropriate construction account.

1.1.5 Temporary Facilities

A. Temporary facilities may be installed to provide access service when necessary, for a maximum period of one year.

(T)

B. Where it is necessary to place temporary facilities in advance of the permanent underground telephone system in order to provide telephone service, the Telephone Company may require the applicant to pay the estimated nonrecoverable costs of the temporary facilities. If the required costs under the above described conditions apply, the Telephone Company has the right to refuse installation of the temporary facilities until the required costs are paid to the Telephone Company.

1.1.6 Special Conditions

A. In circumstances where the application of these rules appears impracticable or unjust to applicant or the Telephone Company, or discriminatory to other customers; e.g., difficult rock conditions, the Telephone Company or applicant shall refer the matter to the Missouri Public Service Commission for special ruling or for the approval of special conditions which may be mutually agreed upon prior to commencing construction.

Access Line

Communication facilities from the customer premises to the central office for the provision of communication services.

Access Service

The provision of access to the communication facilities of the telephone company.

Channel (See Circuit)

Circuit

A term applies to a channel used for the transmission of electrical energy in the furnishing of access service.

Connecting Company

A corporation, association, partnership or individual owning or operating one or more exchanges and with whom traffic is interchanged.

Contract

The term "contract" refers to the service agreement between a customer and the Telephone Company under which services and facilities are furnished in accordance with the provisions of the applicable tariffs.

Customer (See Subscriber)

With the exception as customer referenced in tariff 50-23 "Discontinuance of Service" refers to residential customers and not business or government entities.

Demarcation Point

The point of connection, provided and maintained by the Telephone Company, at which the station wiring becomes dedicated to an individual customer's use. For an individual customer dwelling this point of connection will generally be the modular jack incorporated into the customer side of the Network Interface Device (NID). The drop wire and the network protector will continue to be provided by, and remain the property of, the Telephone Company. The demarcation point is usually the point at which the Telephone Company wiring connects with the customer's wiring.

Exchange

A basic unit for the administration of communication service in a specified area, called the exchange area which usually embraces a city, town, or village and its environs. It usually consists of one or more central offices, together with the associated plant used furnishing communication service to the general public within that area.

Exchange Area

The territory served by an Exchange.

Extra Listing

Any listing of a name or information in connection with a subscriber's telephone number beyond that to which the subscriber is entitled in connection with his regular service.

Individual Line

An exchange line designed for the connection of only one main station. (Not a private branch exchange trunk line).

Installation Charge

A nonrecurring charge made for the furnishing of telephone access service, which may apply in place of or in addition to access service connection and other applicable charges for service.

Local Message

A communication between a calling access line and any other access line within the same local service area of the calling access line.

Local Access Service Area (See Local Service Area)

Local Service Area

The area throughout which communication access service is rendered to a calling access line without the application of toll charges.

Network Interface Device (NID)

A device wired between the telecommunications protector and the inside wiring to isolate the customer's equipment from the network.

Premises

The term "same premises" shall be interpreted to mean all portions of the same building occupied by the same customer.

Service Connection Charge

A charge applied to establishing access service, changing or relocating service on the subscriber's premises.

Subscriber

The individual, partnership, association, or corporation which contracts for telephone service and is responsible for the payment of charges and compliance with the rules and regulations of the Telephone Company.

Toll Message

A message from a calling access line to an access line located in a different local access service area.

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
